We did not discover Rallies and Chapters for many years but for the last 8 years we have attended every National Convention, discovered the joys of volunteering at the rallies and are members of 14 Chapters in 4 Areas of FMCA.

We are hoping to see everyone at our next FMCA Convention in Perry, Georgia, March 10-13, 2021. Our next INTO Rally is tentatively scheduled for April 2021, in Lebanon, Tennessee. Early arrival will begin on April 17<sup>th</sup> to provide time for early chapter rallies and to explore the Nashville area before the start of the rally on the 19<sup>th</sup>. The INTO Executive Board met in Lebanon for a planning session and our annual board meeting the end of September. We have most of the rally details worked out and on our website ([www.fmcainto.com](http://www.fmcainto.com)) by the time you receive this newsletter. We also discussed the feasibility of a destination rally in Las Vegas for 2022. For planning purposes, we are looking at 4 days, at least 4 shows on the strip, and once again using ridesharing for our transportation. Comments and suggestions are always appreciated.

We are excited to continue working with the new and reelected members of the INTO Executive Board. A special welcome for our two new Vice Presidents, Harry Hentschel and Sue McMahon, to the INTO Board. I cannot say enough about the rest of the board; all have served for multiple years and without their dedication and knowledge, INTO would not be where it is today. INTO is not going to be the same with the departure of George and Maxine Schremp and Rodger and Diana Donnelly on the board.


I want to especially thank the INTO Board for their hard work and dedication during these past 2 years. Without a devoted Board working together on behalf of the INTO Area we could not be successful.



We also made a brief trek to the nearby Quartzsite RV Show in January and saw many FMCA friends at that venue.

After the FMCA Conventions, Monaco International Pre-Rallies, and rallies of Rocky Mountain Monacos, Monacos-In-Motion, and American Coach Club, all which we were planning to attend, and others were cancelled early in the year, we elected to stay at our Winter place in Arizona longer than usual. However, after returning to Colorado and two months at home working on deferred maintenance, painting the house, etc., we HAD to get back on the road to get some rest. Hello. My name is Sue McMahon and I am one of your new INTO Vice Presidents.





## SOI's Calgary Stampede

July 8 - 13<sup>th</sup> and/or July 14 - 19<sup>th</sup> 2021

YES, INTO is going to join the SOI Chapter at the Calgary Stampede in 2021. With a little bit of luck, and the virus under control, we will be able to go up to the Calgary, Alberta, Canada's Stampede and have a "Great Time."



The Calgary Stampede is an annual rodeo, exhibition, and festival held every July. The ten-day event, which bills itself as "The Greatest Outdoor Show on Earth," attracts over one million visitors per year and features one of the world's largest rodeos, a parade, midway state shows, concerts, agricultural competitions, and chuckwagon racing.

We have 50 RV parking spots with 30-amp electricity. You have the choice to go the first week, the second week, or both weeks, it's your choice! Last year we sold out early for parking spots, so don't delay. Currently for the first week of the Stampede, we have 37 spots available, but in the second week we only have 9 spots left.
